Roses are not the only treasure of the Gardens. The Mediterranean Borders are well established, and Borders are well established, and the Begonia Garden is twice yearly planted with seasonal bedding. Shrubberies are strategically designed and located to add a sense of mystery and privacy to the Gardens.

Queen Mary's Gardens was originally used as a plant nursery while the park was under development as a residential estate. It was then laid out by Marnock and Burton as the Gardens of the Royal Botanic Society of London until disbanded in 1932 and much of the original charture remainer.
